PROCLAMATION

OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS: Oregon has long worked to prevent and control noxious weeds that are not native to the state,

and that by their invasive nature, pose a threat by impacting Oregon's communities and

resources; and

WHEREAS: Oregon farmers, ranchers, nursery growers, recreational groups, and public and private land

managers clearly acknowledge the negative economic and environmental impacts posed by

the presence and spread of invasive weeds; and

WHEREAS: Oregon farmers, ranchers, conservation groups, and public and private entities, unanimously

support implementation of integrated weed management projects to protect Oregon's natural

resources and economy; and

WHEREAS: The latest studies available indicate that the economic impact of just 25 noxious weeds in

Oregon is estimated to reduce Oregonian's personal income by \$83.5 million per year, which

is equivalent to 1,900 jobs lost to Oregon's economy.

NOW,

THEREFORE: I, Kate Brown, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim May 13-19, 2018 to be

OREGON INVASIVE WEED AWARENESS WEEK

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
